

## Habitat celebrates new home dedication

Habitat for Humanity of Bucks County celebrated the dedication of Evita's new home on Woodland Avenue in Morrisville on June 29.

Volunteers, friends, family, new neighbors, donors and distinguished guests gathered in

celebration of the completion of Habitat Bucks' 116th home with Evita and her children. This is one of four new single-family homes on adjacent lots that will pave a much-needed path to homeownership for these families.

Evita and her two children, who are currently living doubled-up with family, will make this their home. High rent prices prevented Evita from living independently. She believed that homeownership was out of the question for the same reason, too costly, until she found Habitat.

## **Woods Services** appoints vice president of medical affairs

Kolesk has been appointed vice president of medical affairs and managed care at Woods Services in Langhorne, a nonprofit, multi-service popula-tion health management and advocacy organization that serves children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and complex medical and behavioral health-care needs.

In this new role, Kolesk, a New Jersey family physician for two decades who later had a distinguished career as a hospital administrator with Virtua Memorial Hospital and Virtua Health in Marlton, N.J., will oversee Woods and its population health management strategy, which includes the integration of primary and specialty care with behavioral health, and becoming a special-ized patient-centered medical home in Pa. and N.J.

In addition, Kolesk will guide the launch and expansion of Woods' primary care centers in

Jersey in partnership with Woods affiliate, Legacy Treatment Services, well as collaborations with Jersey New DR. STEPHEN J. hospitals and

medical centers for the provision of medical services to peo-

ple with IDD and patients with behavioral challenges. He will also work with Woods' health care professionals at the Medical Center at Woods in Langhorne to ensure the ongoing delivery of quality care to the individuals Woods serves.

Kolesk resides in Delran, N.J., with his wife of 44 years, Kathleen. They have three children and five grandchildren.

Raquel Braemer has been named exuctive director of HealthLink Dental Clinic in Southampton.

She has been credentialed as a CFRE (certified fund raising executive) since 2016 and is a graduate of the nonprofit management certificate program at La Salle University's Nonprofit Center.
